

Smoke Free Arizona Act

The Smoke Free Arizona Act prohibits smoking in an enclosed area. An enclosed area means all space between a floor and ceiling that is enclosed on all sides by permanent or temporary walls or windows (exclusive of doorways) which extend from the floor to the ceiling. Enclosed area includes a reasonable distance from any entrances, windows and ventilation systems so that persons entering or leaving the building or facility shall not be subject to breathing tobacco smoke and so the tobacco smoke does not enter the building or facility through entrances, windows, ventilation systems or any other means. Based on these restrictions – effective May 1, 2007 we will no longer allow smoking on the upper patios on the interior of the Recreation Centers, or outside the entrance and exit doors of any of the Facilities. Effective May 1, 2007 the Recreation Centers, Fine Arts and Learning Center, Administration Building and RV Storage area are entirely smoke free, as are the pool and patio areas. In addition there will be no smoking in the vicinity of any entrance or exit of any of the association owned facilities. The penalties for violation of this law are severe, and the attorney general's office will impose the fine on the person violating the law.
