

Cooking at WV with Chuy and Jan!

I absolutely love oranges! Here in Peoria we are blessed to have an abundance of oranges growing all around us. Put oranges together with chocolate chips and WHAM you have a winning combination. You get a wonderful citrus aroma and a fresh bite to a familiar cookie.

Orange, Sunflower Seed, & Giant Black Raisin Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients:

1 cup all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup packed brown sugar
3/4 stick (6 tablespoons) unsalted butter melted and cooled
1 large egg

1 cup old-fashioned rolled oats

1/2 teaspoon vanilla1 T. orange extract

Grate the skin of an entire orange

1/2 cup chocolate chips 1/2 cup giant black raisins 1/2 cup hulled sunflower seeds

Procedure:

- Heat oven to 375 degrees.
- Cream together brown sugar, butter, egg, vanilla, and orange zest.
- Stir together oats, flour, baking soda, and salt.
- Stir egg mixture into flour mixture until just combined.
- Stir in chocolate chips, raisins and sunflower seeds.
- Make mounds of batter 1-1/2 inches apart on baking stone or cookie sheet.
- Bake until cookies are golden and edges are crisp, about 15 minutes.






another poignant story about a reclusive movie star, Meredith White. When her husband leaves her for a younger



VIETNAM WAR MEMORIES -



WALT VICKERY

Walt Vickery grew up in Seattle, Washington and enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in 1957, and served this country for 22 years. He was reassigned from Edwards AFB to Japan as an AC Crew Chief and later retrained to become an Egress-Ejection Seat Specialist. He served two tours in Vietnam and was injured in a rocket attack on Da Nang AFB in July of 1971.

Walt was stationed in Germany for 4 years and saw duty in Spain, Italy, North Africa, England, and Scotland. He also served with the world-renowned USAF Thunderbirds as an Egress Systems Tech and Assistant AC Crew Chief. He flew in the back seat during arrival air shows and also became a member of the Mach Busters Club by flying faster than the speed of sound.

Walt retired from the Air Force as a Master Sergeant in 1979 and went to work for a large aerospace company. His military awards include the Purple Heart, Meritorious Service, and 2 commendation medals along with other awards.

He met and married his wife of 57 years, Dagmar, while stationed in Germany. They have one son and two grandchildren and have loved living in WV since 2001.

BERNARD "BERNIE" BERSANO

Bernard "Bernard "Bersano joined the USMC in 1952 and served in Japan, Korea, Vietnam, and U.S. East Coast. He was also part of a covert mission to help get civilians out of Cuba, just an hour before JFK announced the embargo on that country.

His most rewarding assignment was participating in the 18-24 month evaluation of the GV1, which was a precursor to the KC-130. This aircraft was an extended-range tanker version of the C-130 Hercules transport aircraft, which was modified for aerial refueling.

Bernie eventually became a Captain, and is honored to have received several campaign awards. During his military career, he was most challenged by being away from his family for lengthy periods. Bernie remained in the reserves from 1974 to 1982.

In 1959 Bernard married a fellow "sailor," Joyce, who served in the Navy. The couple moved to WV in 2001 and loved retirement life here. Sadly, Joyce passed away in 2019.

WVA Treasurer's Report

For the month ended January 31, 2021

The following figures are subject to audit. However they fairly represent the approximate financial condition of the Association at month end.

GENERAL OPERATING FUND

(Funds designated for day-to-day operations.)

Cash and CD's on hand at the end of January was \$2.9million. For the full year 2021 we are forecasting total revenue of \$2.84 million, of which approximately \$2.6 million will come from homeowner annual assessments. Budgeted expenses forecast for 2021 are \$2.75 million with an additional \$2,000 expected to transfer to our Reserve Fund. Through January both revenue and expenses are in line with forecast.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE FUND

(Funds for major repairs / replacements / improvements)

Cash and CD's on hand at the end of January was \$3.3 million. In 2021 we are forecasting revenue of \$876,000. Revenue comes primarily from new homeowner preservation fees and \$95,000 transferred from the Operating Fund. Reserve fund expenditures budgeted for 2021 is \$952,000. Projects budgeted for in 2021 include Stadium Court renovation, Vistas Pool repairs, Exterior Gym and meeting area and a number of different infrastructure type expenditures.





estbrook Village boasts numerous bodies of water of varying sizes. WV ponds are plentiful, and they naturally draw the waterfowl population to their habitat. It is not surprising that numerous types of ducks land here for either a brief migratory stopover or an extended stay. Upon closer look at these webfoot creatures, one can discover fascinating and differentiating characteristics among the countless duck species.

Here are a few of the species that are seen often at WV!

The Mallard is the largest and most common duck variety found in Arizona. The couples nest throughout the high country of the state, namely in the White Mountains and Flagstaff area. They are also adaptable and often found in urban areas. They have been known to form pairs and breed in backyards with swimming pools in Phoenix and Tucson.

The American Wigeon is part of a group of ducks known as "dabblers." They nibble aquatic vegetation from the surface or tip up rather than diving. When taking flight, they spring into the air instead of pattering across the water. Male American Wigeons wear a beautiful iridescent green stripe on their heads.

Lesser Scaup ducks boast speculums on their wings along with blue bills and gray or black feet *(see cover photo)*.

Typically found on reservoirs and lakes, Scaup feed on aquatic submergent vegetation and invertebrate animals. Scaup will also utilize river courses in Arizona and appear in small flocks of less than 10.

The Common Merganser is quite common in Arizona.
Found on nearly all

reservoirs and river courses in the State the merganser will dive for its food that consists of small fish.

The Hooded Merganser is

rarely seen in Arizona and breeds in forested wetlands and forages by diving and swimming underwater,

propelled by feet. It finds food by sight as its eyes are adapted for good underwater vision.



WV resident photographer, Tanju Bayramoglu, can be found observing our native wildlife with his camera in hand. He found the following interesting fact about the sleeping habits of ducks:

When a flock of mallard ducks are together, that means every duck can take half-brain naps and keep one eye open looking for trouble. Research done at Indiana State University initially discovered this phenomenon and noted that half-napping ducks positioned on the outside of a group would keep their outside eye open and the eye facing towards the group of ducks closed. Meanwhile, ducks in the center of the flock would go fully to sleep, closing both eyes.





A Chat with Honorable George T. Anagnost

WV resident Judge George Anagnost, known to many as "Judge A," spoke with Westbrook Village Living Magazine, and shared some details regarding his life and his service to the great City of Peoria.

WVL: Where do you preside as judge specifically?

I was appointed to the Peoria Municipal Courts as the first full-time judge in 1994 by the late Mayor Ken Forgia. The court has jurisdiction over traffic, criminal misdemeanor cases, City Code compliance, and protective orders.

Tell us about the changes you have you seen since your appointment and what aspects you enjoy seeing today?

The growth and changes in the city have been astounding to watch. When I began in 1994, there were between 50 and 60,000 residents in Peoria, and the streets were flanked by many sprawling greenbelts and open land. Fast forward to today, and we are proud of having brought in the spring baseball leagues and now Cactus League. The changes are truly stunning. Mayor Carlat and Council are providing the same energy and commitment that have given Peoria its outstanding reputation.

Can you tell us a bit about your background?

I am from upstate New York, where I attended college in the mid-1970's. Upon graduating, I moved to Arizona (when the only tall building in downtown Phoenix was the Valley Bank Center), began in corporate practice, and then transitioned to private practice. I was later asked to be a part-time judge, where I started out on the bench

Who were your early influencers?

I grew up in a college town and was surrounded by lawyers and challenging teachers. This piqued my interest in all things law at an early age.

What is your favorite thing to do in your spare time?

I do a lot of reading and writing and enjoy bridge and playing chess.

Notably, Hon. Anagnost has written many articles and book reviews published broadly, including in State Bar periodicals.

What is a favorite memory at the City?

Being part of Peoria's remarkable growth is a memory of its own. On a personal level, Peoria for many years sponsored a statewide chess tournament for grades K-12. One year we brought in Garry Kasparov, considered one of the greatest chess player of all-time. One event was a fifteen-board "simul" at Sunrise Mountain High School where Garry played each challenger moving board to board until all games were completed. As the Peoria Times headline read the next day, "Checkmate Times Fifteen". It was quite memorable for all.

Is there a favorite quote you can share?
