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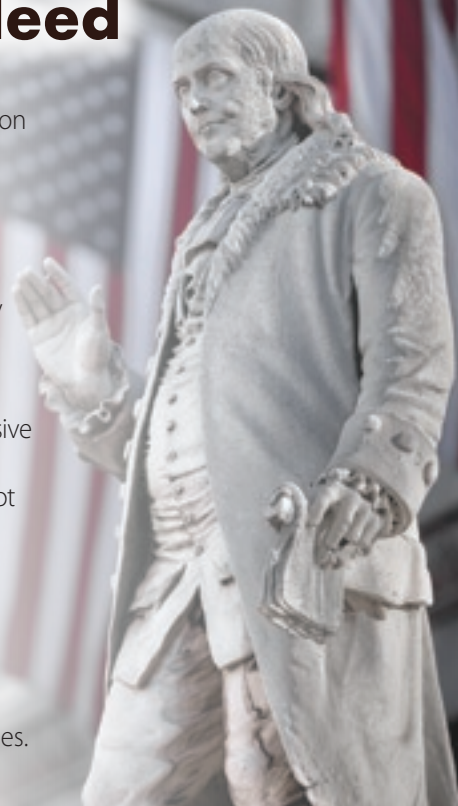
In the month we celebrate the birth of our nation, it is good to reflect on what preceded the Declaration of Independence and what we gained from that noble decree. A burning desire for freedom from tyrannical rule consumed the 13 colonies and fueled those who took up their pen to sign.

The resulting *republic* was and is nothing short of a miracle, and is saturated in the fruits of freedom from start to finish: Freedom as individuals, freedom as groups, freedom for all. Freedom to worship as one decides, freedom to conduct business as one decides—all within a moral code of conduct. Many nations have since sought to emulate the concept of a republic such as we enjoy.

Jesus spoke of freedom often, and desired freedom for all: "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36). In that statement, He spoke of being freed from the bondage of sin via His expensive sacrifice. *Giving up* already-attained freedom certainly results in a return to bondage. The apostle Paul warned the Galatians, writing them: "For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery" (Galatians 5:1).

Likewise, Americans should never relinquish freedoms our forefathers sought to secure for us. There is an often-quoted story about Benjamin Franklin, who was walking out of Independence Hall after the Constitutional Convention in 1787, when a Mrs. Powell shouted out, "Doctor, what have we got? A republic or a monarchy?" His answer was: "A republic, if you can keep it."

If we can keep it, indeed. May each of us hold on to freedom as if our life depends on it--because it does.

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Westbrook Village: *Wonderful Beginnings - part 2*

Phase 1 Golf Club and Phase II Course Built

In the June issue we looked back at how Westbrook Village Phase I began sprouting up in the 1980's, and folks from all over came to buy their property and see it built and outfitted with interiors. It was not long before more subdivisions filled the landscape, springing up around what would be the gorgeous Lakes Golf Course.

While the Lakes Golf Club and Course was evolving beautifully, Vistas Phase 2 Westbrook Village home building was well underway, and a beautiful new golf course was being designed and built by Tucson's Ken Kavanaugh. He was tasked with transforming flat land into a rolling course with a variety of holes and wide fairways. In 1990, the Arizona Golf Journal called the Vistas "a secret pleasure for those fortunate enough to call it home."

In April of 1994, a handful of Westbrook Village residents joined together to find the funds needed to purchase both golf courses from the outgoing builder. They were up against many challenges, but were successful in their efforts. Quality homes, amenities and golf allowed residents to boast they lived in the most beautiful active adult community in the West Valley. In fact, by the fall of 1994 Westbrook Village was chosen among the "Top 20 Best Retirement Communities in America," by national publication, *New Choices* magazine.

A promotional piece produced by UDC, the builder, asked this question: "Where can you roll a bocce, swim a lap, crewel a hankie, throw a pot, read a book, lathe a leg, nap in the sun, pump some iron, chat with friends, return a serve and birdie the third?" All WV residents know the answer—*Westbrook Village*, of course. That question can certainly be answered the same way today!

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ESCAPE to Sedona

There is nowhere close by more picturesque than the lovely Sedona, tucked into red rocks and surrounded by towering rock structures like the 6,355-foot Thunder Mountain. Close by, because it is less than a 2-hour drive from your driveway, and just perfect for a short getaway.

Summer temperatures average between 5 and 10 degrees cooler than Peoria during the summer months, so travel plans to Sedona should always include ways to stay cool while taking in the sights.

For lodging, options are endless on [tripadvisor.com](https://www.tripadvisor.com) or your favorite vacation rental website. One possible itinerary could include a stay at Sky Ranch Lodge, a

motel that sits on the edge of Airport Mesa, 500 feet above town. Nearby trails give eagle-eye views of Sedona's most stunning rock formations. Make sure to catch sunset early evening from just below the Lodge. Next day, have breakfast at the Mesa Grill at Sedona Airport located walking distance from the Lodge.

Both swimming opportunities in state park creeks nearby and scenic drives are plentiful. Check out the jeep tour companies on North State Route 89A in the heart of Sedona to set up for a fun-filled romp on the rocks. Rent a bike or bring your own wheels to enjoy the 235 miles of designated bike trails. Visit the Chapel of the Holy Cross, a structure built by a student of Frank Lloyd Wright that is a must-see man-made wonder.



For some relaxing activity, drive down the hill to Tlaquepaque Arts & Shopping Village-- a favorite and charming place to browse shops and eat lunch. Take in visually stunning creations done by local artists at the art galleries dotting the map. There are also local wineries and breweries to sample, so do some a quick online hunt to discover several choices.

AVOIDING THE BIGGEST THREATS TO A COMFORTABLE RETIREMENT

If you save and invest for decades, you'd like to know you can retire without financial worries. Nonetheless, you still must be aware of some threats to a comfortable retirement.

These threats include:

- **Inflation** – Inflation has been high recently, but even a mild inflation rate can seriously erode your purchasing power. In fact, with just a 3% inflation rate, your expenses could double in about 25 years. So, if you're going to rely on your investment portfolio for a sizable part of your retirement income, you will need to own a reasonable number of growth-oriented investments whose potential returns can equal or exceed the inflation rate.
- **Excessive withdrawals** – Once you retire, you should establish a withdrawal rate for your portfolio. Some people make the mistake of withdrawing too much, too soon once they're retired. A financial professional can help you determine a withdrawal rate that's appropriate for your needs.
- **Market volatility** – The financial markets will always fluctuate. When you're still working, this volatility may not be such a problem, but when you retire, you don't want to have to sell investments when their price is down. To help prevent this, you can tap into the cash in your portfolio, assuming you have enough to cover several months' worth of living expenses. You could also draw on a CD "ladder" to provide you with resources for the next few years and allow your equity investments time to recover their value.
- **Unexpected costs** – You had them when you were working, and you'll probably have them when you're retired. But if you've established an emergency fund containing a year's worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid account, you may be able to "ride out" these costs without jeopardizing your investment portfolio. Be sure to keep these reserves separate from your typical day-to-day accounts to avoid the temptation of spending your emergency money.

Retirement can be a pleasant time in your life — and you'll enjoy it more if you're prepared for the challenges that face all retirees.

- Our annual Audit is nearing completion and going very well.
- Landscape & Facilities Committee has worked on the horseshoe and cornhole area, south of the woodshop and their recommendation will be going to the Board of Directors on June 7, 2023.
- Two new Rec Center front desk staff members have been hired and are going through training, stop in and say hello! Also, a new maintenance staff member has been hired and is in training, say hello!
- The Rec Committee appointed an ad-hoc committee to research, discuss and make a recommendation of pickle ball court usage, scheduling and APPL league play. This will be presented at the May 9, 2023, Recreation Committee and then to the Board of Directors at their June 7, 2023, meeting. Thank you to everyone working hard on this ad-hoc committee and working toward what is ***in the best interest of the entire community***.

WVA Treasurer's Report

For the month ended April 30, 2023

"The following figures are subject to audit. However, they fairly represent the approximate financial condition of the Association at month end."

GENERAL OPERATING FUND

(Funds designated for day-to-day operations.)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of April was \$3.0 million. For the full year 2023 we are forecasting total revenue of \$3.1 million, of which \$2.9 million will come from homeowner annual assessments. Budgeted expenses forecast for 2023 are \$2.9 million with \$225,000 expected to transfer to our Reserve Fund. Through April, our revenue and expenses are in line with forecast. However, we continue to monitor expenditures, and experience delays in deliverables, and longer lead times. In addition, there is a large "unknown" as to what may lie ahead with regards to home resales and the overall economy in 2023.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE FUND

(Funds for major repairs / replacements / improvements)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of April was \$3.9 million. In 2023 we are forecasting revenue of \$836,000. Revenue comes primarily from new homeowner preservation fees and \$225,000 transferred from the Operating Fund. Reserve fund expenditures budgeted for 2023 is \$1.2 million. Ongoing expenditures remain planned for total renovation of the Vistas Pool as well as perimeter wall repair and painting, roofing repair. Other normal infrastructure repairs and replacement are also planned for 2023.

On October 25, 2022, The Board of Directors unanimously approved the proposed 2023 budget for both operational and reserve budgets submitted by the Budget Committee.

The Vistas pool project began June 1, 2022 and currently is on schedule for completion June 1, 2023.

These financials will be on file at the WVA Administration Office after noon on Thursday, June 8, 2023, and may be reviewed by Association members. Due to the annual meeting in March, there was no financial report for review. **Please call 623.561.0099 for an appointment.**

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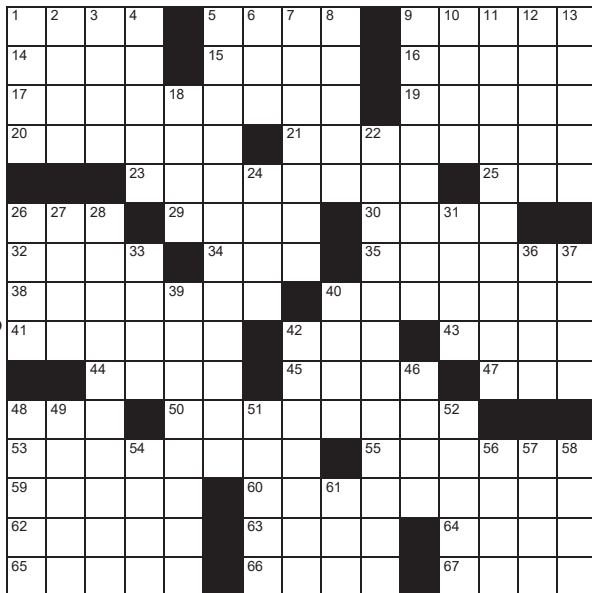

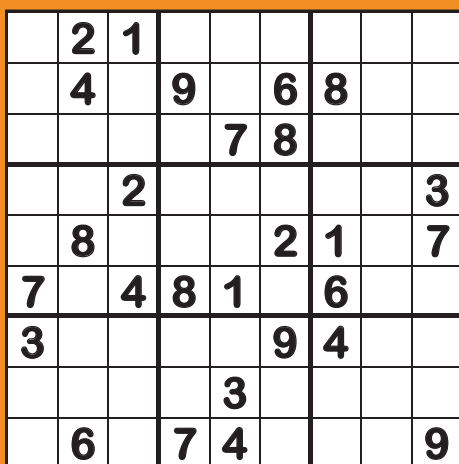

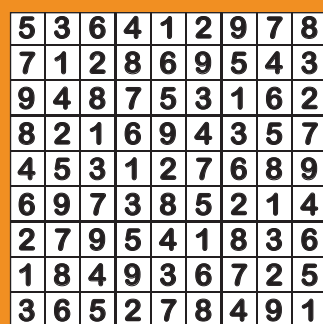

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City of Peoria Update: Mayor Jason Beck

When my family and I made the decision to run for Mayor I made a commitment that I would prioritize public safety and job creation. I have always said that you can tell a lot about people's priorities by where their first dollar goes.

I am proud to announce that on May 2nd we passed the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) that prioritizes Water Infrastructure, Economic Development and Public Safety and gets us back to the basics of taking care of the city while we are in this economic downturn. Some of the Key Areas of Investment are:

- \$171 million for water infrastructure.
- \$13.4 million for public safety.
- \$39.5 million for economic development.

Since our council chambers were opened in 1991, there has been a lot of talk about investing in downtown Peoria. This historic budget finally keeps this promise and makes investments in revitalizing our Historic Downtown Peoria.

After a lot of hard work, citizen feedback, and with the help of the amazing leadership team we have brought to city government, on May 16th we passed our new annual budget with a unanimous 7-0 vote. We now are looking to our future to continue to deliver results and continue to change the way that Peoria does business.

Relationships matter! Peoria has restored a productive working relationship with our state government. During our budget process, we have been collaborating with our state representatives and they have delivered for Peoria.

PET TRAVEL TIPS

There are many who travel regularly with pets, and have likely figured out by now what is needed to ensure a smooth trip. It doesn't hurt to prepare ahead of time, and here are some ideas to consider that might help plan a trip with your pet:

- Check with your vet and make sure your pet is fit to travel. Factors to consider would be age, illness, injury or temperament.
- Take photos of your pet's medical history documents and save them on your phone. In the event of a medical emergency, these documents could be useful for the vet treating your fur baby.
- Purchase an ID tag for your pet's collar that lists your home address and cellphone number.
- If traveling out of state, some states require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, an Official Health Certificate or proof of rabies vaccines.
- Make sure your pet's travel crate or carrier is well-ventilated and large enough for your pet to stand, sit, turn around and lie down.
- Line the carrier with your pet's favorite blanket, or a T-shirt with your scent to help relax a distressed pet.
- Always introduce your pet to the new carrier at home before using it on a trip.
- For air travel, be sure to check your airline's pet carrier size guidelines and specifications before purchasing any new gear. Affix a "Live Animal" label, arrows showing upright position, with owner's name, address, and phone number.
- To keep your dog healthy as you travel, bring along a supply of his regular food. Don't forget bottled water and be sure to bring any medications he needs.
- Be prepared for an emergency. Enter the address and phone number of the nearest 24-hour veterinary emergency hospital into your cell phone, along with the office and emergency number for your regular veterinarian (in case the veterinarians need to speak with each other).

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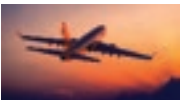
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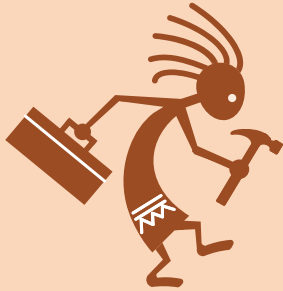

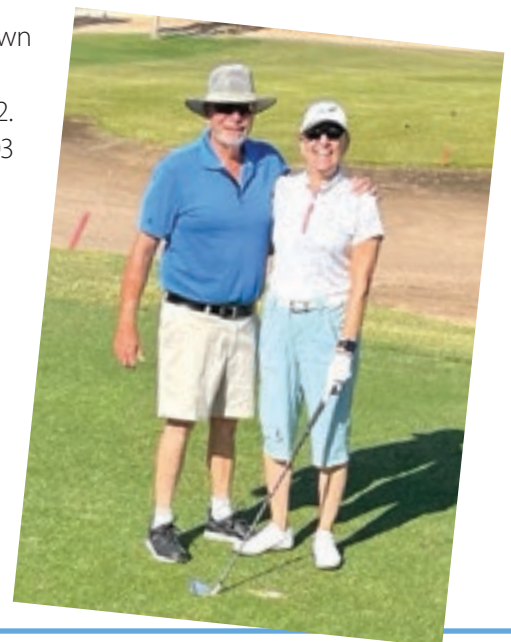
