**Empty Tomb Celebration!** 



# **BRAVING THE SEA:**

# NORMAN PALMER, MERCHANT MARINE

"My Lads, Heave Ho! It's a long, long way to go. It's a long, long pull with our hatches full, Braving the wind, braving the sea, Fighting the treacherous foe; Heave Ho! My lads, Heave Ho! Let the sea roll high or low, We can cross any ocean, sail any river. Give us the goods and we'll deliver, D--- the submarine; we're the men of the Merchant Marine!"

## - Merchant Marine Anthem

Originally from New York State, Norman Palmer has enjoyed living at WV for the past 30 years. At the time he arrived with his wife, he was deemed "too young for Sun City." This Merchant Marine Veteran had long ago left his sea legs to enjoy the desert climate, and volunteer across the city at notable downtown Phoenix locales like the Herberger Theater, Symphony Hall, and the busy Westside Foodbank.

From his WV home, Norman talks about his service to our country in the Merchant Marines. "Roosevelt described it as the 5th arm of service, and there were 250,000 of us during WWII," he recalls, adding, "The Merchant Marines were also known to have the highest rate of casualties."

After a year of college and at the age of 17, Norman was eager to serve on the open sea, and no other branch could afford that duty except for the Merchant Marines. "I was denied ship service by the Navy, as I wore glasses, and so was told I'd have to become a radio man instead," Norman explains. "I left Syracuse for Buffalo, where the MM accepted my application."

His first orders were to report to Sheepshead Bay Maritime Training Center, where he learned trades such as engineering propulsion, deck crew maintenance, ship handling skills, cargo

> boom operations, and more. Over the following months, Norman served on numerous ships in both the Atlantic and Mediterranean Oceans, docking at ports in North Africa, Italy, Spain, and France. Some of the ships included Army transport ships, troop ships, and Army hospital ships.

"What was also unique about life as a Merchant Marine was that we were not paid on a consistent basis. We signed a contract each time we boarded a ship and that is when the pay started; our pay ended once we docked again," says Norman.

> the Merchant Marines. He notes, "There are only 400 or so of these medals awarded since the time of George Washington," so it is a singular distinction to have been awarded with. He was also recently received the Norwegian Cup Medal honoring his service in WWII.

We honor you, Norman Palmer, and thank you for your service to our country!







**Nordstrom Tomato Basil Soup** 

(Small batch)

Years ago, I worked at Nordstrom. This soup was one of my favorites! These cool days make this a perfect soup for lunch or dinner. And, this is a small-batch recipe that is easy to prepare.

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 6 tablespoons olive oil
- 4 large carrots, peeled and diced
- 1 large onion, sliced
- 1 tablespoon dried basil, crushed
- 3 (28 ounce) cans whole peeled plum tomatoes (84 ounces total)
- 1 quart chicken stock
- 1 pint heavy cream

Salt and pepper

# **DIRECTIONS:**


- 1. In a large, heavy saucepan, heat the olive oil over medium-high heat until shimmering.
- 2. Add carrot and onion and cook until beginning to soften, 10 minutes, then add basil and cook until vegetables are completely soft, about 5 minutes more.
- 3. Add tomatoes and broth, bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer for 30 to 45 minutes.
- 4. Allow the soup to cool somewhat, then

- purée until smooth in a blender or an immersion blender.
- 5. Strain the purée before returning it to the pot for a smoother texture.
- 6. Add cream little by little over low heat until the desired texture is reached. Do not boil it!
- 7. Season to taste with salt and pepper, and serve warm.

Serve with crusty French bread or Crostini's.

One thing I've learned after living in a retirement area for the past 24 years is that WV residents love "Free!" So, now that I have your attention, I'll tell you about Helping Hands, whose services are Free!

So many people say to me, "I never knew what Helping Hands did" and many of them are long-time residents. I finally figured out why Helping Hands is invisible: it's not something you want to need. Westbrook Village is a vibrant, active adult community with so many wonderful activities and the focus is on all the fun things to do living here, in addition to professional sports, concerts & theatre, to name a few. As our General Manager, Karen Jones says, "If you're bored, it's your own fault."

But the NEED does arise for some. Mostly what Helping Hands does is take people to appointments (mostly medical). We do grocery shopping and visiting, including respite sitting for caregivers. We do minor handyman chores. We have a lending closet of medical equipment available to any resident without cost (some items have fully refundable deposits).

In just the past few months, three ladies we're helping have expressed that without Helping Hands, they would not have been able to stay in their homes. Some people may need more than we do as volunteers, but we have lots of information on people you can hire for more help. One of the private caregivers we refer to has been helping Westbrook residents for over 20 years and every single person says she is an angel. If we don't do it, we can help you find someone for just about anything you need. We have an amazing group of volunteers willing to help. Call a coordinator with your requests (see below).

The Caregiver Connection in January was an amazing success — a full house, with many from outside of Westbrook attending. One of the most interesting things presented was Palliative Care, offered by Hospice of the West. This FREE program supports patients with education, support and community resources. This program is appropriate for patients with debilitating disease, chronic illness ad life-threatening illness, who are not ready for Hospice, but need help navigating their health care among the many doctors they may be seeing. Caregiving is exhausting, and there is no shame in asking for help.

# **CALL TO REQUEST HELP**

# - VETERAN TREASURE AND WV POSSE CO-FOUNDER -

W.E. (Bill) Sandvig | June 25, 1927 – January 4, 2024

Born in Minneapolis, Minnesota, Bill Sandvig enlisted in the Navy after high school during the latter part of WWII. He was deployed to the Marshall Islands and worked aboard ships in the South Pacific, including Bikini, until after the attack on Pearl Harbor. Bill was honored to be added to the Arizona Veterans Hall of Fame in 2004

After returning from military service, he enrolled and graduated from the University of Minnesota, majoring in science, sociology and accounting. While in college, Bill and his high school sweetheart, Norma, rekindled their romance and married in 1949. They had three children: Bill, Steve, and Laurie. After the Vietnam War, Bill and Norma opened their arms to several homeless Vietnamese boys, three of whom are still part of the family today.

Bill's worked for his father's accounting business and successfully owned three Star Bowling and Golf stores in Minnesota. Bill and Norma retired to Arizona, and were one of the first owner residents in Westbrook Village.

Bill had volunteered for the Minneapolis Sheriff's Department, and this background helped him play a key role in founding the WV Posse. He served as both Commander and Duty Sergeant and dedicated over 20,000 volunteer hours to make this community safe.

A Celebration of Life for Bill was held on February 17, 2024 at the Congregational Church of Sun City. The service was posted on the church's Youtube channel, where it can still be found for any who wish to view it.

# **WVA Treasurer's Report**

For 2023 Year End for the month ending December 31, 2023

"The following figures are subject to audit. However, they fairly represent the approximate financial condition of the Association at month end."

#### **GENERAL OPERATING FUND**

(Funds designated for day-to-day operations.)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of December was \$2.9 million. For the full year 2023 we are forecasting total revenue of \$3.1 million, of which \$2.9 million will come from homeowner annual assessments. Budgeted expenses forecast for 2023 are \$2.9 million with \$225,000 expected to transfer to our Reserve Fund. Through November, our revenue and expenses are in line with our forecast. However, we continue to monitor expenditures, and experience higher pricing in products, labor, and availability. In addition, there is a large "unknown" as to what may lie ahead with regards to home resales and the overall economy in 2023. A more complete financial report for 2023 will be presented at the March 2024 Annual Meeting.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE FUND

(Funds for major repairs / replacements / improvements)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of November was \$4.0 million. In 2023 we are forecasting revenue of \$836,000. Revenue comes primarily from new homeowner preservation fees and \$225,000 transferred from the Operating Fund. Reserve fund expenditures budgeted for 2023 is \$1.2 million. Ongoing expenditures remain planned for completing of the Vistas Pool as well as perimeter wall repair and painting, roofing repair. Other normal infrastructure repairs and replacement are also planned for the remaining of 2023. A more complete financial report will be presented at the March 2024 Annual Meeting.

In addition, our General Manager, Karen Jones, reported recently to the Board of Directors, that we have received a partial dollar amount for the Employee Retention Credit (ERC) sometimes also known as the Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC), a refundable tax credit for businesses that had employees and were affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. We continue to wait for any remaining credits of which the association has applied. Any and all refundable amounts are being reviewed by our accountants. A full report will be given at the Annual Meeting on March 20, 2024.

These financials will be on file at the WVA Administration Office after noon on Thursday, March 25 2024, and may be reviewed by Association members. Should you have any questions, please call 623 561-0099 for an appointment.


My wife, Debby, and I are snowbirds. We first came down to WV in January of 2022. We generally spend between December and April here



I love to write about legal topics and history. My biography of Alton Brooks Parker, the 1904 Democratic nominee for president, has just been published by SUNY Press. I am almost finished with a second book: a detailed look at the Democrats' difficulties in selecting a presidential nominee at the end of the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th century—and how interparty conflicts generally precluded the Democrats from electing a president between the late 1890s and the early 1930s.

Alton Brooks Parker was the only major party candidate for president who had never had a biography written about him. He was a fascinating man—lawyer, judge, politician, civic leader—and yet his life story had basically been lost to the annals of history. My biography of Parker provides an in-depth look into the life, career and legacy of one of the most important New Yorkers of the Gilded Age. Parker had the courage to challenge Theodore Roosevelt for the presidency in 1904—at the height of Roosevelt's popularity—and was a transition point between the old, conservative wing and the new, progressive wing of the Democratic Party. This book is a must read for anyone who is interested in the law, the presidency, history, presidential politics or the Gilded Age. You can get a copy at www.sunypress.edu.

# WV Hiking Club SPRING 2024 HIKE SCHEDULE

# In general, hikes are classified as follows:

Easy – 2 to 4 miles with elevation gains up to 400 feet. Moderate – 4 to 7 miles with elevation gains up to 750 feet. Difficult – 7 or more miles with no limit on elevation gain. Total Ascent – adds all the up elevation changes together.

- Mar 1 Go John/Quartz/Slate Loop Cave Creek Regional Park – about 5.9 mile loop. Moderate. Consists of several connecting trails through typical Sonoran desert. Climb Quartz trail and then drop into a wash. Several washes and parts of trail are rocky. Fee per vehicle. Restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 60 miles RT.
- Mar 8 Quartz Mine/Mountain Wash Loop Buckeye

   Skyline Regional Park approximately a 4.5 mile loop.
   Moderate to difficult. Typical Sonoran desert. Trail drops about 150' into a valley and then climb to Lost Creek Trail, and encounter a quartz outcropping/mine. At Lost Creek will climb about 300' in 0.5 miles to a saddle and then drop to Mountain Wash. Good views of Verrado and valley to east and Buckeye to south. Driving distance approx.70 miles RT.
- Mar 15 Cholla Mountain Loop Scottsdale McDowell Sonoran Preserve Northern Region - about 7.4 mile loop & RT. Easy to moderate. Follow a series of trails to Cholla Mountain Loop. NW side will find Cathedral Rock and

- several Native American metates. At southern end of loop is rock formation called the Amphitheater. Views of several iconic mountains. Restrooms at TH. Lunch after hike at The Thumb. Driving distance approx. 80 miles RT.
- Mar 22 Pass Mountain Usery Mountains 7.8 mile loop. Moderate. Great views of Goldfield Mountains, Four Peaks, and Superstitions. Possible to see Fountain Hills fountain. Parts of trail are rocky several washes. Restrooms at TH. Driving distance is approx. 120 miles RT.
- Mar 29 Pipeline/Yavapai Point Loop Lake Pleasant about 6.0 mile loop & return. Moderate. Start at south trailhead and drop into Pipeline Cove to cross bridge and continue to south trailhead and do Yavapai loop to the top of Yavapai Point. Great 360° views from top. May see some burros. Park fee per vehicle. Restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 45 miles RT.
- Mar 29 End of Year Party More information to come.



"If you're on the trail, you don't need to be worried at all as long as you keep your eyes open and don't put your hands and your feet where you can't see them. If you see a snake, don't go near it. Just go around it. if you do that, it's impossible to be bitten," he said.




