I was very honored to have been one of the sponsors for the 18 Hole Couples Member-Guest Invitational (page 27) – what a great event and celebration to be a part of!





INSPIRATIONAL CORNER:

Deliverance

We all get into a tight corner at different times throughout our life. It may sometimes feels like a fork in the road, reminiscent of the classic poem, *Two Roads* by Robert Frost. Other times we might recall that the tight corner we found ourselves in required a major force to deliver us out of a predicament.

It was a major predicament the children of Israel or Jacob found themselves in as recorded in the Bible—they were slaves in Egypt, which kept them separate as a people group, but also very oppressed. Their cries reached heaven, and God had already forged His plan to be carried out by a uniquely positioned individual, Moses. Moses heard God's heart and voice and carried out His plan with precision. Those who did not or would not cooperate with liberating the people found themselves on the opposite end of the hand of God.

The New Testament documents Moses as a man of faith in Hebrews 11, the same faith that helped God's people obtain freedom from slavery:

"Faith enabled Moses to choose God's will, for although he was raised as the son of Pharaoh's daughter, he refused to make that his identity, choosing instead to suffer mistreatment with the people of God. Moses preferred faith's certainty above the



momentary enjoyment of sin's pleasures...Faith opened the way for the Hebrews to cross the Red Sea as if on dry land, but when the Egyptians tried to cross they were swallowed up and drowned!"

Earlier in that same chapter, the definition of faith is provided: "Faith is the conviction of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1). When we don't physically see our deliverance manifesting this moment, yielding to God's plan puts us in the right spot for being delivered out/walked out of dire predicaments by God Himself.

Simple prayer: "Dear God, I am unable to deliver myself out of this troublesome predicament. Because You are bigger than me, I ask for you to intervene in my life with a timely miracle-In Jesus' precious' Name, Amen."

WVA Treasurer's Report

For 2023 Year End for the month ending December 31, 2023

"The following figures are subject to audit. However, they fairly represent the approximate financial condition of the Association at month end."

GENERAL OPERATING FUND

(Funds designated for day-to-day operations.)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of December was \$2.9 million. For the full year 2023 we are forecasting total revenue of \$3.1 million, of which \$2.9 million will come from homeowner annual assessments. Budgeted expenses forecast for 2023 are \$2.9 million with \$225,000 expected to transfer to our Reserve Fund. Through November, our revenue and expenses are in line with our forecast. However, we continue to monitor expenditures, and experience higher pricing in products, labor, and availability. In addition, there is a large "unknown" as to what may lie ahead with regards to home resales and the overall economy in 2023. A more complete financial report for 2023 will be presented at the March 2024 Annual Meeting.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE FUND

(Funds for major repairs / replacements / improvements)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of November was \$4.0 million. In 2023 we are forecasting revenue of \$836,000. Revenue comes primarily from new homeowner preservation fees and \$225,000 transferred from the Operating Fund. Reserve fund expenditures budgeted for 2023 is \$1.2 million. Ongoing expenditures remain planned for completing of the Vistas Pool as well as perimeter wall repair and painting, roofing repair. Other normal infrastructure repairs and replacement are also planned for the remaining of 2023. A more complete financial report will be presented at the March 2024 Annual Meeting.

In addition, our General Manager, Karen Jones, reported recently to the Board of Directors, that we have received a partial dollar amount for the Employee Retention Credit (ERC) sometimes also known as the Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC), a refundable tax credit for businesses that had employees and were affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. We continue to wait for any remaining credits of which the association has applied. Any and all refundable amounts are being reviewed by our accountants. A full report will be given at the Annual Meeting on March 20, 2024.

These financials will be on file at the WVA Administration Office after noon on Thursday, March 25 2024, and may be reviewed by Association members. Should you have any questions, please call 623 561-0099 for an appointment.



















WV Hiking Club SPRING 2024 HIKE SCHEDULE

In general, hikes are classified as follows:

Easy – 2 to 4 miles with elevation gains up to 400 feet. Moderate – 4 to 7 miles with elevation gains up to 750 feet. Difficult – 7 or more miles with no limit on elevation gain. Total Ascent – adds all the up elevation changes together.

Background: East Verde River **Lower Right:** Expansive views of Chimney Rock-Thunder Mtn. Loop and also Doe Mountain flat on flat with Bear Mountain in background

- Apr 5 East Verde River (New) Payson 4.2 mile in and out. Moderate. Trail follows FR 502 to the East Verde River –about 1.8 miles from the TH. Descend about 150 feet in about 0.5 miles into a wash, then ascend about 150 ft in next 0.6 miles and then have a gradual descent to the river. Rocky hike with rolling juniper rangeland before getting to the tree lined and grassy river area. Many great views of Mazatzal Mountain Wilderness and its highest peak. North Peak. No restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 210 miles RT.
- Apr 12 Chimney Rock/Thunder Mtn Loop no Sugarloaf

 Sedona. 5.9 -mi loop of several trails. Moderate. Figure 8
 loop views of many beautiful red rock formations: Thunder Mountain (Capitol Butte), Chimney Rock, Ship Rock, Sugarloaf Summit, Coffee Pot, etc.) from every angle. Many maneuvers involving Lower Chimney Rock, Little Sugarloaf, Chimney Rock, Thunder Mountain, and Teacup Trail junction that overlooks Coffee Pot, Wilson Mountain, etc.,

- Take Sugarloaf back to Thunder Mountain to Andante and back to TH. No facilities at TH. Driving distance approx. 220 miles RT.
- Apr 19 Pivot Rock/Spring/Canyon (New) Clints Well 6.2 mile RT. Moderate. Hike to Pivot Rock, then up canyon to the spring. Then retrace steps to wider part of the canyon and hike to an old cabin ruin and then return to the TH. The forest is a mix of pines, oak, and aspen with many ferns. Much of the hike will be in a
 - the hike will be in a canyon with many outcroppings of layered fossiliferous limestone. No restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 230 miles RT. Final 3 miles is dirt road and high clearance is best.


The Posse has produced a **map** that shows all the neighborhoods in both sides of our village as well as all the major facilities. The maps are *free* our office in the FALC
