





Jack took the Honor Flight--the trip of a lifetime for him

JACK WILLIAMSON

Jack Williamson joined the Air Force in 1954 and commenced his basic training at Sampson Air Force Base in New York. He was then assigned to Chanute Air Force Base in Illinois, where he received aircraft and jet engine training. He was a student in aircraft maintenance and repair, and then became an instructor in that field.

His next assignment was at Williams Air Force Base, Arizona, where he performed jet aircraft maintenance. Next, he was stationed at Hickam Air Force Base in Hawaii, where he served as Crew Chief for the Aircraft Maintenance and Repair. He was also Dock Chief for 50-hour post

flights and in charge of Taxi and Run-up for the F86 and T33 aircrafts. Jack was not "boots on the ground" during war times but was responsible to repair and maintain aircraft readiness for engagement.

While in Hawaii for four years, Jack recalls the military ran Operation Star Fish, during which the nighttime sky turned to daylight for a period of time. "The goal was to ensure communication efforts continued during a disaster, and the conclusion was that communication was not impaired."

After completing his military service in 1963 as a Staff Sergeant, Jack worked in Research and Development at Sperry Flight Systems, which was bought out by Honeywell; he subsequently retired from Honeywell.

Jack recommends that ALL veterans sign up at *honorflightaz.org* to go on an Honor Flight, adding, "It is a 'trip of a lifetime,' and you see things the average tourist does not see in Washington D.C."

Jack earned several campaign medals and awards for his 10 years of service, and he was awarded the Warrior Medal of Valor, complete with Native American purification rites and blessings. While this award is not listed on his official records, he feels very honored to have received it.

Jack and his wife, Pat, moved to Westbrook in late 2019. They enjoy how friendly and welcoming the WV community has been. Jack is happy to have joined the Veteran's Club and the Technology Club.

We honor you, Jack Williamson, and are grateful for your service to our country!

June was a fairly busy month. We helped 15 different residents with 25 rides, groceries and special requests such as moving trash bins to the curb. Six of our most active volunteers are gone. Barry Spiegel and Allen McCracken deserve recognition for their help. Allen, our newest volunteer, is very responsive and willing to help. Thanks and welcome to Allen and thanks to all of our great volunteers!

Here are some of the special things our volunteers do, usually with very quick replies.

- Appointments for residents with unusual diseases with doctors in Scottsdale. I was worried about getting a response and got THREE! Just amazing!
- Taking residents to critical chemotherapy appointments. Helping a resident put meals in the microwave while she was restricted to bed.
- Other immediate needs, like a cracked tooth or ER visit.
- One resident, who recently lost driving, visits her husband in a memory care facility.

We try to accommodate any reasonable request from those who are homebound, injured or invalid recovering from surgery, illness or accident.

Here is the process if you need help. Call one of the Coordinators (or Text) with your NAME, the DATE, TIME and LOCATION of your appointment, or the details of your request, if not a ride. Requests are emailed to each volunteer on the roster, and volunteers who are available respond and we assign the request. The volunteer calls the resident requesting help, usually within a day or two, and introduces themselves. And that's Helping Hands in a nutshell.

If someone falls, ALWAYS call 911!

We don't do lifting, bathing or personal care, but have a resource list for those services, including home health care, meals and assisted living locators. The service directory ads in the back of this *WV Living Magazine* are a great place to find resources, or Call Roz for more info.

City of Peoria: Mayor Jason Beck

Better at 70: Peoria is Realizing its Full Potential

This June, the City of Peoria celebrated its 70th anniversary as an incorporated city. As we look to the future ahead, it's important to reflect and pay homage to Peoria's rich history and our beginnings as a city.

Peoria began as an agricultural community with its roots in farming and citrus cultivation. Following several years of discussion and a narrow vote, Peoria was incorporated on June 7, 1954, with County Supervisors appointing a sevenmember town council to serve the inaugural term. The new council was sworn in and held its first organizational meeting shortly after, selecting schoolteacher Roland Pomeroy as the city's first mayor. The growth in Peoria accelerated through the last quarter of the twentieth century. From a population of 4,792 in 1970, the city grew to 12,351 in 1980 and over 50,000 in 1990.

From the completion of the Peoria Sports Complex in 1994 to opening of the City's first water treatment plant in 2002, and in the decades since, Peoria continues to be a thriving city committed to its residents.

Today, Peoria sits at a population over 200,000 as one of the fastest growing cities in the valley. As more people decide to call Peoria home, the City Council is heavily focused on driving future revenue and amenities through economic development, maintaining safe communities and schools, and stewarding a healthy water supply.



Through efforts of economic development, we've been proud to announce projects like Amkor, bringing 2,000 quality jobs to our communities, and HonorHealth, a 95,000-square foot medical campus that will bring employment and close-to-home access to medical services.

Through our city's commitment to public safety, we've added 6 School Liaison officers,

dedicated solely to keeping Peoria students safe, and have created the West Valley's first advanced aviation unit with the purchase of a fully outfitted Bell 505 Helicopter to support both Police and Fire.

Through the prioritization of water security, we've committed \$170 million in the current budget to support water infrastructure, and an additional \$500 million dollars within our 10-year Capital Improvement Plan.

As your Mayor, this is the future Peoria I envision: a Peoria where residents can work and live in their city; a Peoria that does not raise taxes; a Peoria where residents can feel secure in their communities; a Peoria where students and parents can trust the safety of their local schools; and a Peoria where our water supply is fully secured into the future.

In March 2017, Peoria introduced its first official city flag. The colors, inspired by the local landscape – brown, rust, and blue – symbolize unity among all residents, from one end of the city to the other. The three stars represent Peoria's Past, Present and Future. They illustrate the following shared principles:


- Courage of the founding pioneers who conquered a harsh life in the desert;
- Strength of the men and women who steered our evolution into a modern city;
- Pride in our City, that driving force that propels us to reach our full potential.

As Mayor, I continue to envision a Peoria that honors the courage and strength of those who have come before us, while ensuring that we are fully focused on providing the best of quality of life for our current residents, and those to come in the future. My driving force as Mayor has always been the pride that I have in my city. It is through that pride, that I will continue working on behalf of Peoria to help us reach our full potential.

Yield: about 30 cookies

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- ¹/₂ cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2¹/₄ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ¹/₂ teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon imitation vanilla extract

- 1 ¹/₂ cups semisweet chocolate chips
- ³/₄ cup chopped pecans (optional)


DIRECTIONS:

Cream butter. Add sugar and beating until fluffy. Add eggs and beat.


In separate bowl combine flour, soda, and salt and mix into creamy mixture. Stir in vanilla, chocolate chips and pecans. Using teaspoon, scoop small individual balls up from bowl and place on ungreased cookie sheet. Space cookies apart by at least 2 inches. Bake at 375° for 12 to 14 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove and let cool on wire rack.

Secret ingredient (Shhh! Don't tell anyone): Using imitation vanilla (rather than vanilla extract) for this recipe gives a special essence to these cookies that sets them apart from the others — you'll see!

The **Veterans Crisis/Military Crisis Line** is a free, confidential 24-hour service that provides specialized care



to veterans in crisis and resources to their families and friends and can be accessed by telephone, text, or online chat. It provides immediate crisis intervention and, when necessary, connects veterans with local services, such as VA suicide prevention coordinators or emergency services.

The upcoming August meeting will feature Tom Sheets, Col., USMS (retired), speaking to the group about the tragic situation described above here. Please plan on attending so that you will be equipped with information for yourself and/or anyone else you know who is struggling in this way. 

WVA Treasurer's Report

For the month ending May 31, 2024

"The following figures are subject to audit. However, they fairly represent the approximate financial condition of the Association at month end."

GENERAL OPERATING FUND

(Funds designated for day-to-day operations.)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of May was \$3.0 million. For the full year 2024 we are forecasting total revenue of \$3.3 million, of which \$3.0 million will come from homeowner annual assessments. Budgeted expenses forecast for 2024 is \$3.3 million with \$125,000 expected to transfer to our Reserve Fund. Through May, our revenue and expenses are in line with our forecast. However, we continue to monitor expenditures, and experience higher pricing in products, labor, and availability. In addition, there remains a large "unknown" as to what may lie ahead with regards to home resales, interest rates and the overall economy in 2024.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE FUND

(Funds for major repairs / replacements / improvements)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of May was \$4.2 million. In 2024 we are forecasting revenue of \$782,000. Revenue comes primarily from new homeowner preservation fees, and \$125,000 transferred from the Operating Fund and budgeted interest of approximately \$24,000. Reserve fund expenditures budgeted for 2024 is \$1,142,250. Ongoing expenditures remain planned for perimeter wall repair and painting, Lakes Complex Asphalt replacement, and the Fitness Center Architect. Other normal infrastructure repairs and replacement and expenditures will be addressed as needed.

These financials will be on file at the WVA Administration Office after noon on Thursday, July 5, 2024, and may be reviewed by Association members. Should you have any questions, please call 623 561-0099 for an appointment.

The Wild-Free Roaming Horses and Burros Act, passed by Congress in 1971 protects these beautiful creatures as "living symbols of the historic and pioneer spirit of the West exist in our State of Arizona." Around 400 wild horses live in herd-protected areas run by the Bureau of Land Management in the Tonto National Forest and on the Navajo reservation in NE Arizona. The herds are managed by the US National Forest Service and the non-profit Salt River Wild Horse Management Group.

WV resident, Tanju Bayramoglu, has enjoyed capturing them on his camera, and explains, "These horses are used to seeing humans, and both Arizonans and out-of-state visitors love going to visit them around the Bush Highway section of the Tonto National Forest.

What resulted was sparkling, gorgeous glass hearts set in a frame for each of her family members to keep the memory of her mother alive.

"Our family is spread out across the country, and we did not have a formal memorial service, so the hearts became a great way for each family member to have a part of my mom. None of them had seen it before, and the whole family was amazed and grateful for the hearts," adds Sue.

The captivating heart displays became an ongoing gift that Sue could do for loved ones. Very soon after that, Sue found herself



creating sacred hearts for a longtime close friend and family, following their painful loss of a husband and father..

Sue is thrilled to now create these treasures for her WV neighbors, and is offering her services for anyone seeking to memorialize their loved ones--whether it is a beloved pet, or someone who recently passed, and whose cremains are available to the family. Different colors can be chosen, and the end product is simply but beautifully framed. "You can place the framed heart on a memory wall, or we do small ones for kids so that they can display them on a small easel."
