



Finally, don't miss the Happenings page on page 26 and above all, relish the fun and camaraderie to be had in this amazing place called Westbrook Village!









Our amazing volunteers covered 51 requests for rides and other assistance, from medical transportation, to visiting nursing home, grocery shopping, and putting trash out and back! These 51 requests were done by 14 volunteers. Our busiest volunteer was again Allen McCracken, followed by Catherine Nagy, who has also been doing trash cans for over a year now for one resident. Lorraine Brugh and Connie Chakravarty were also quite busy with rides in addition to can duty. I want to recognize Mary Thorson, who has been making daily phone calls to one of our residents for over a year now. He loves her calls and she enjoys visiting with him every day. Another outstanding volunteer is Anne Apker, who visits with Sandy Rozzen weekly and helps her keep all her life organized, including going with her and transcribing the doctor visit. Exceptional volunteers!

Already for September, we have scheduled twice a day phone calls for a shut-in whose partner will be out of town for several days. September is already shaping up to be at least as busy as August. We can always use more volunteers. It seems the number of requests has been growing.

We have a new volunteer to welcome, Sue Missler. She is a winter visitor but will help out as often as she can and maybe remotely with some phone calls. Welcome Sue.

Many first time callers say they were reluctant to call, because they didn't want to "bother" us, but that is what we're here for. So call with your request and we will do our best to help you or find someone to help you if it's something we don't do.

If someone falls, ALWAYS call 911!

We don't do lifting, bathing or personal care, but have a resource list for those services, including home health care, meals and assisted living locators. The ads in the back of this magazine are a great place to find resources, or Call Roz for more information.



Caregiver Support Club at WV

with Toni Stuart, Co-Facilitator

Are you a caregiver heading toward burnout? You don't have to do this all alone!

I have been a caregiver for my husband with Alzheimer's Disease for the past 10 years. I can't say enough positive things about the value of support groups. It takes a fellow caregiver to fully understand what the journey is all about. Since I moved to WV five years ago and joined the support group here, I've learned so much, felt supported and understood by the group, and made some great friends.

These are folks who understood my life and we've learned of local resources together, right here at WV!

Getting help can make you a better caregiver!

Most caregivers regularly turn down help from others. They feel guilty that they can't 'handle it' themselves. They think they should be able to do it all. I tend to do this, **BUT** I've learned that people offering to help really do mean it and that learning to receive the help lowers my stress and renews me to be a better caregiver. Support groups will help you work through the guilt and fear by allowing someone else to help carry the load you're shouldering."

Your mind might be playing tricks on you!

- 1. You might mistakenly think 'everyone else' is doing a 'better' job at caregiving. FALSE.
- 2. Everyone is a human with good and bad days. FACT.
- 3. Don't compare yourself to others; it will steal your joy. Get to a support group to hear that you are not alone, and that others are also experiencing similar challenges.
- 4. You might also mistakenly think you 'shouldn't' want time for yourself to attend a support group. On airplanes they tell us to put the oxygen mask on ourselves FIRST so we can help others. Same principle applies here. You MUST care for yourself while you are caring for others.

The reality:

If a health crisis pops up that can set progress back, managing emotions can be tough. Being able to talk with others about things can help you feel less alone.

Think of support group like going to the gym for your emotions and your thoughts

Top 5 caregiving tips that work for me.

1. Attend a support group--you are not alone

- 2. Don't be too proud to ask for help when needed; we are all human and need a Plan B
- 3. Socialize with family, friends, neighbors-don't isolate yourself
- 4. Find some joy everyday: walk, read, TV, hobbies
- 5. Try to stay healthy- Good sleep and eat healthy

WVA Treasurer's Report

For the month ending July 31, 2024

"The following figures are subject to audit. However, they fairly represent the approximate financial condition of the Association at month end."

GENERAL OPERATING FUND

(Funds designated for day-to-day operations.)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of July was \$2.5 million. For the full year 2024 we are forecasting total revenue of \$3.3 million, of which \$3.0 million will come from homeowner annual assessments. Budgeted expenses forecast for 2024 is \$3.3 million with \$125,000 expected to transfer to our Reserve Fund. Through July, our revenue and expenses are in line with our forecast. However, we continue to monitor expenditures, and experience higher pricing in products, labor, and availability. In addition, there remains a large "unknown" as to what may lie ahead with regards to home resales, interest rates and the overall economy in 2024.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE FUND

(Funds for major repairs / replacements / improvements)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of July was \$4.3 million. In 2024 we are forecasting revenue of \$782,000. Revenue comes primarily from new homeowner preservation fees of \$633,000.

Transferred revenue of \$125,000 from the operating budget and interest of approximately \$24,000 was put in the budget. However, through July, interest revenue earned is approximately \$64,000 which exceeds our projected budgeted amount of \$24,000.

Reserve fund expenditures budgeted for 2024 is \$1,142,250. Ongoing expenditures remain planned for perimeter wall repair and painting, Lakes Complex Asphalt replacement, and the Fitness Center Architect. Other normal infrastructure repairs and replacement and expenditures will be addressed as needed.

These financials will be on file at the WVA Administration Office after noon on Thursday, September 5, 2024. Since there was no Board of Directors meeting in August, the July Treasurers Report will be approved at the September 4 Board of Directors meeting and available the following day. 





WV Hiking Club FALL 2024 HIKE SCHEDULE

In general, hikes are classified as follows:

Easy – 2 to 4 miles with elevation gains up to 400 feet.

Moderate – 4 to 7 miles with elevation gains up to 750 feet.

Difficult – 7 or more miles with no limit on elevation gain.

Total Ascent – adds all the up elevation changes together.

Background: View of Montezuma Well which can be seen from Well Vista Trail on October 25

- Oct 18 Pivot Rock/Spring/Canyon (New) Clints Well 6.2 mile RT. Moderate. First hike to Pivot Rock, a large limestone structure with massive foundation that supports a balancing capstone with grass & tree sprouts growing in the porous surface. Continue up canyon to a a spring, then retrace steps to the wider part of the canyon and hike to an old cabin ruin and then return to TH. Forest is mix of pines, oak, and aspen with many ferns. Much time in canyon with many outcroppings of layered fossiliferous limestone. No restrooms at TH. Driving approx. 230 miles RT. Last 3 miles is dirt road and high clearance is best.
- Oct 25 Cedar Knoll/Sunset Loop/Well Vista (New) Verde Valley – McGuireville, about 6.9 mile RT. Easy. In and out with a loop in the middle hike, using 3 connecting trails in the Wickiup Mesa Trail System. First 0.7 miles through pastures dotted with yucca and juniper using the Cedar
- Knoll Trail. Connect with the Sunset Loop Trail and gradually climb between tree covered knolls to the Well Vista Trail, which will take us to a viewpoint that overlooks Montezuma Well and Wet Beaver Creek. On clear days, view of Munds Mountain Wilderness, Sedona's red rocks, and San Francisco Peaks. No restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 170 miles RT. After hike lunch at the Peach Tree Cafe in Lake Montezuma.
- **Nov 1** Hotshots Juniper Tree (New) Northwest of Prescottabout 4.8 miles RT. Moderate. Hike takes us to very large alligator juniper (recognized as a Champion Tree, estimated to be over 1000 years old saved from the Doce Fire in June 2013 by the Granite Mountain Hotshots about a month before 19 of them perished in the Yarnell Hill Fire. Good views of Big Chino Valley and distant Santa Maria Mountains. No restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 190 miles RT with the last 0.7 miles on a well-maintained dirt road. After hike lunch at The Local.

It's a new season; the weather is changing, the days are getting shorter and it gets dark earlier. Is your garage door open? The single most risky behavior with regard to theft in the Village is leaving your garage door open and unattended. Of all the issues we encounter in the Village, this one gives the Posse the most angst. Now that it is getting dark earlier, it is time to ramp up theft prevention mode.

The criminal element knows that a grab and run is the least risky action. In the last couple of months, we have lost cars, electric bikes, golf clubs and more from open garages. We have also experienced home entry through the open garage.

They can rob your open garage in **less** than one minute and be out of your community.

Next month, the Posse is holding our Safety and Security POSSE FEST in the Vistas' FALC parking lot (Nov 3). We will be giving away some security hardware and it will include a *device* that lets you know you've left your garage open. Stop by and see the demo.

Did you know that the WVA permits (and encourages) motion detection lights? It is not the high intensity spotlights (those are not allowed) but rather regular bulbs that illuminate when someone comes near. Light is one of the things all thieves avoid, especially lights that come on when you approach. These lights are inexpensive and can be used on the porch, garage lights, path lights and on your back patio. We will have some motion detection lights to demo and give away at the Posse Fest as well.

Your Posse has a final caution to our neighbors at Westbrook. We encounter most fall victims outside the home and off the normal path. The bottom line is – we are getting older – when you go outside, carry your phone with you. Don't walk on the stones if possible; as most falls occur outdoors as a result of poor footing. If you do fall, don't try to "pop back

up" like you did when you were 20. Assess what's happened and call for help. The number is 911, and don't hesitate to use it if you've fallen.
