





forward to doing so in person at this year's Annual Veterans Ball on Thursday, November 7 (see details on page 26).






# **INSPIRATIONAL CORNER:** God Enriches

In November of 1894 a proclamation was issued by then Governor of the Arizona Territory, Louis Hughes. Arizona had officially become a U.S. Territory 31 years prior (1863). Hughes had arrived at this moment, having grown up as an orphan in Pennsylvania and served as an "indentured servant" to a farmer until age 16. He enlisted as an abolitionist in the Union Army at the outset of the Civil War, attended seminary and college, and as a lawyer moved to Arizona with his wife, Josephine.

Governor Hughes served as territorial governor from 1893 to 1896, and was considered a "highly principled reformer." One biographer described him as "one of the few governors who helped clean up Arizona and prepare it for statehood."

This proclamation heralds a grateful cry during the Thanksgiving season 130 years ago:


# Historic Thanksgiving Proclamation in Our State

1894 Thanksgiving Proclamation 🕌 Territory of Arizona

Phoenix, Sunday, November 11, 1894

"To the People of the Territory of Arizona, Greeting:

Recognizing the manifold blessings of a kind Providence during the past year, and in accordance with a revered custom of the American people, and in conformity with the proclamation of the President of the United States, I do hereby appoint Thursday, November 29, 1894, a day of Thanksgiving and Prayer to be observed by the people throughout the Territory.



Since the people of our Territory have been especially favored with more than ordinary peace, plenty and prosperity, and the absence of want and distress in its many forms, let us with grateful hearts cease from all business pursuits on that day and with one accord 'Give thanks unto the Lord for His merciful kindness to the children of all men.'"

Indeed, early leadership of our state surely saw ahead to the blessing it would be to many throughout its colorful history. The motto for the seal of the Territory of Arizona was emblazoned with "Ditat Deus," or "God Enriches."

Happy Thanksgiving, Arizona!

# WY VETERAN TREASURE

# ROBERT (BOB) BEAN

I grew up in a small town in Vermont with few opportunities. In 1979, I joined the Navy after high school to be a dispersing clerk (accountant). I was persuaded to join the nuclear program as an electrician, which was a lifealtering change that landed me in Orlando Florida for Nuclear Power School and Nuclear Prototype School in Windsor, Connecticut and the Nuclear Prototype School in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. I gained in-depth nuclear operation knowledge, electrician skills, and leadership knowledge. This led me to my next assignment on the USS Omaha SSN 692 (fast attack submarine) as an electrician, where I found that with every piece of equipment I worked on, from nuclear pumps to toasters. I got to know everyone well--especially the cooks, who loved to break stuff. The cooks would knead bread dough in the mixer until the fuses blew and then they would know the dough was ready!

Fast forward past two Western Pacific deployments and my leaving the Navy as an E6 to where I am today. I am most grateful for the many close friendships that have continued throughout the years to the present. Everything I learned in the Navy has been applicable to many of the things I have done in my life.

The most challenging part of the service for me was long deployments under the ocean, but I got to see a lot of great places when we surfaced. Another difficulty was that they allowed smoking on the submarine, and I was not a smoker. Another favorite adventure occurred when the submarine was "depth charged" by our own people to see what would happen. There was a lot of shaking going on!

I feel honored to have received a Unit Citation award and two commendations for my Western Pacific deployments.

After my service concluded in 1985, I was hired by Arizona Public Service (APS) as a Nuclear Operator. I became a Reactor Operated and over my 33 years at APS and the parent company Pinnacle West, I had many roles, including Director of Operations and Director of Finance. My last position before retiring was the Manager of Commercial Generation Interconnection.

My wife, Lorrie, and I purchased a home in Westbrook Village in May of 2023, gutted it and completed the remodel by October 2023.

We love Westbrook Village because the community is beautiful, well managed, and there are so many activities, from concerts to golf and pickle ball. We love having great neighbors and wonderful community participation.

We honor you, Bob Bean, and are grateful for your service to our country!





September was a crazy, busy month! We received 70 requests for help from 15 different residents, taken care of by 14 volunteers. Marla Putnam and Allen McCracken were our outstanding volunteers. Thanks to our incredible volunteers - all receive praises from those they help.

Welcome to our newest volunteer, Kjersten Merila, a winter visitor from Minnesota from September to May; she is excited to join us and looks forward to helping people.

Since it's the time many people return and new people move in, we would like to remind everyone what Helping Hands does. We primarily provide rides to medical appointments and rides to grocery shopping or shopping for them. A few of our volunteers are able to do minor handyman work such as filters and lightbulbs. If you attend the Caregivers Support Group, we can provide respite sitting while you attend the weekly meetings. Helping Hands also does phone call check-ins, known as "Phone Pals." We can visit by phone or in person.

We help following a surgery, illness, accident or temporary need. But, we don't provide caregiving, such as personal hygiene, meal prep, or any type of medical assistance. Some situations turn into ongoing help, on a case by case basis, such as terminal illness. Another popular service is our medical equipment lending closet, housed at the Vista's Rec Center. Wheelchairs, transport chairs, wheeled and standup walkers, knee scooters, shower chairs, canes, and crutches are available to residents - free for up to 60 days. Wheeled equipment requires a deposit of \$100, check only. Deposit fully refunded when equipment is returned on time.

We don't do lifting, bathing or personal care, but have a resource list for those services, including home health care, meals and assisted living locators. The ads in the back of this magazine are a great place to find service providers, or call Roz for more information.



# **WVA Treasurer's Report**

For the month ending August 31, 2024

"The following figures are subject to audit. However, they fairly represent the approximate financial condition of the Association at month end."

### **GENERAL OPERATING FUND**

(Funds designated for day-to-day operations.)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of August was \$2.3 million. For the full year 2024 we are forecasting total revenue of \$3.3 million, of which \$3.0 million will come from homeowner annual assessments. Budgeted expenses forecast for 2024 is \$3.3 million with \$125,000 expected to transfer to our Reserve Fund. Through August, our revenue and expenses are in line with our forecast. However, we continue to monitor expenditures, and experience higher pricing in products, labor, and availability. In addition, there remains a large "unknown" as to what may lie ahead with regards to home resales, interest rates and the overall economy in 2024.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE FUND

(Funds for major repairs / replacements / improvements)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of August was \$4.3 million. In 2024 we are forecasting revenue of \$782,000. Revenue comes primarily from new homeowner preservation fees of \$633,000.

The 2024 reserve budget includes a transferred revenue of \$125,000 from the operating budget and projected interest of approximately \$24,000. Through August, interest revenue earned is approximately \$65,400 which exceeds our projected budgeted amount of \$24,000.

Reserve fund expenditures budgeted for 2024 is \$1,142,250. Ongoing expenditures remain planned for perimeter wall repair and painting, Lakes Complex Asphalt replacement, and the Fitness Center Architect. Other normal infrastructure repairs and replacement and expenditures will be addressed as needed.

These financials will be on file at the WVA Administration Office after noon on Thursday, October 3, 2024. The August Treasurers Report will be approved at the October 2 Board of Directors meeting and available the following day. Should you have any questions, please call 623 561-0099 for an appointment.



# WV Hiking Club FALL 2024 HIKE SCHEDULE

# In general, hikes are classified as follows:

Easy – 2 to 4 miles with elevation gains up to 400 feet. Moderate – 4 to 7 miles with elevation gains up to 750 feet. Difficult – 7 or more miles with no limit on elevation gain. Total Ascent – adds all the up elevation changes together.

- Nov 1 Hotshots Juniper Tree (New) NW of Prescottabout 4.8 miles RT. Moderate. Hike to very large alligator juniper (over 1,000 years old and recognized as a Champion Tree, the largest of its kind in the nation (it was saved from the Doce Fire in June 2013 by the Granite Mountain Hotshots days before 19 of them perished in Yarnell Hill Fire). Next, follow FR 9261U for the first 0.8 miles and drop about 100 ft. Connect to Upper Pasture Trail (#38) and climb about 245 ft in the next 0.9 miles to White Rock Spring Trail. No restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx.190 miles RT-final 0.7 miles on a well maintained dirt road. After hike, lunch at The Local.
- Nov 8 Turpentine/Black Hill/Whiskey Bottle Loop –
   Scottsdale McDowell Sonoran Preserve Northern
   Region about a 6.6 mile loop. Moderate. Follow
   series of trails, typical Sonoran desert. Follow contour
   of Fraesfield Mountains with good views of the
   Superstitions, Weaver's Needle, Four Peaks, the Verde
   Valley, Mazatzal Mountains, and preserve mtns.
   Driving distance approx. 80 miles RT. After hike lunch
   at The Thumb.
- Nov 15 Maricopa Camp Creek Falls (New) Tonto National Forest Bartlett Dam Road –Most of hike follows segment 22 of Maricopa Trail. From trailhead cross Bartlett Dam Road and follow through rolling hills of catclaws and yuccas for about 1.8 miles. Descend into Blue Wash, turn left and follow Camp Creek to box canyon and 20 ft waterfall. Views of Four Peaks, Mount Ord, Mazatzal Range, and Humboldt Mountain. No restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 80 miles RT. Required for park entrance at TH--either: Tonto Pass from Tonto Forest Range Station entrance about 0.1 miles prior to the TH, OR Senior Pass for National Parks.
- Nov 22 Agua Fria TH to Pleasant Harbor Road Lake Pleasant approx. 5.4 miles RT. Moderate. Part of Maricopa Trail system, starts at Agua Fria TH just off SR 74 and Beardsley Canal Road. Relatively flat the first 0.5 miles, then climbs about 125′ 0.2 miles and then flat for another 0.2 miles before dropping into large wash. Good views of Hank Raymond Lake, downstream from Lake Pleasant Dam. Follow wash approx. one mile before climbing from wash 165′ in 0.3 miles. Driving distance approx. 30 miles RT.
- Nov 29 No hike Thanksgiving




