


strategies are already underway for what to get the grandkids (the annual quest for those perfect gifts).

### WVA Treasurer's Report

For the month ending September 30, 2024

"The following figures are subject to audit. However, they fairly represent the approximate financial condition of the Association at month end."

#### **GENERAL OPERATING FUND**

(Funds designated for day-to-day operations.)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of September was \$2.0 million. For the full year 2024 we are forecasting total revenue of \$3.3 million, of which \$3.0 million will come from homeowner annual assessments. Budgeted expenses forecast for 2024 is \$3.3 million with \$125,000 expected to transfer to our Reserve Fund. Through September, our revenue and expenses are in line with our forecast. However, we continue to monitor expenditures, and undergo higher pricing in products, labor, and availability. In addition, there remains a large "unknown" as to what may lie ahead with regards to home resales, interest rates and the overall economy in 2024.

#### **REPLACEMENT RESERVE FUND**

(Funds for major repairs / replacements / improvements)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of September was \$4.4 million. In 2024 we are forecasting revenue of \$782,000. Revenue comes primarily from new homeowner preservation fees of \$633,000.

The 2024 reserve budget includes a transferred revenue of \$125,000 from the operating budget and projected interest of approximately \$24,000. Through September, interest revenue earned is approximately \$78,500 which exceeds our projected budgeted amount of \$24,000.

Reserve fund expenditures budgeted for 2024 is \$1,142,250. Ongoing expenditures remain planned for perimeter wall repair and painting, Lakes Complex Asphalt replacement, and the Fitness Center Architect. Other normal infrastructure repairs and replacement and expenditures will be addressed as needed.

These financials will be on file at the WVA Administration Office after noon on Thursday, November 7, 2024. The September Treasurers Report will be approved at the November 6 Board of Directors meeting and available the following day. - The Westbrook Village Association Board of Directors voted to implement electronic voting beginning in 2025 for the Annual Meeting and Board of Director elections. We will be educating the community on this process. There will be three (3) options to vote 1 online, 2 telephone, 3 request a paper ballot. We are excited to begin using this simple process. Thank you to all the wonderful volunteers that have assisted in the mailings, and ballot counting for the annual meeting through the years. We could not have done it without you!
- The 2025 WVA Budget work has been ongoing in September and presented to the Budget Committee in October. The budget committee is comprised of three (3) Ways & Means members and four (4) Westbrook Village residents that applied to be part of this very important process. Thank you to everyone for your hard work & diligence in this very important process.
- At the 2025 Budget Special Board of Directors meeting on October 30, 2024 the recommended budget for next year from the budget committee was approved by the Board of Directors.
- The WVA Annual Assessment for 2025 will increase by CPI (Consumer Price Index) per our Governing Documents which is 2.5%. Thus, making the **2025** Annual Assessment \$795.90, an increase of \$19.40 from 2024. The annual assessment invoice will be mailed in late November, due January 1, 2025 and a 10% late fee assessed on February 1, 2025 if not paid.
- October BINGO was well attended with 178 players.

- Looking forward to the upcoming POSSE FEST on Sunday, November 3, 2024.
- GM Coffee Talk went very well with good discussions -41 in attendance.





#### The Revitalization of Peoria's Historic Downtown

I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving with family and friends, and that we all had the chance to reflect on the many things we have to be thankful for across our great city.

As Mayor, I have remained committed to fostering an environment that focuses on smart growth, strategic longterm planning, and dynamic economic development. A key piece of this mission has been, and will continue to be, the revitalization of Peoria's historic downtown area.

Peoria's downtown has a rich history that reflects the character of our city. I am a firm believer that we must drive innovation while maintaining our city's roots. Our City Council has prioritized the revitalization of downtown, as we work to transform it into a central hub that celebrates local culture, supports local business, and attracts new development.

Over the past year, we have allocated resources and initiated several key projects aimed at enhancing the downtown experience. By improving public spaces and investing in infrastructure, we are laying the groundwork for a downtown area that maximizes engagement and economic activity.

In this spirit, several key developments are already underway. First, Caldwell County BBQ is set to become a cornerstone of

our historic downtown. Caldwell's first West Valley location will be approximately 6,600 square feet, located between the Fire House Event Center and the former downtown hotel site. The restaurant will feature a large outdoor patio space, and a design that seamlessly connects with the surrounding area.

Following Caldwell's, the Jefferson House is set to be located at the northwest corner of 83rd Avenue and Jefferson Street. This venue will feature a mix of restaurants, a bar, retail, and event space. Developed in partnership with the owners of The Churchill in Phoenix and the existing Driftwood Coffee, Jefferson House will serve as a community gathering hub for special events and local pop-ups.

In addition to these developments, we are also celebrating Greystar's Peoria Place, a \$500 million mixed-use master plan that will bring luxury apartments and retail spaces to our downtown, and the renovations to the City Hall's 'Front Lawn,' aimed at creating a public space for community gatherings and events.

Growing Economic Development opportunities in the city's Historic Downtown has been a decades-long priority for the city, and I am proud that our council has taken meaningful steps towards achieving that goal. I look forward to continuing our work with the community and nearby stakeholders to turn the revitalization of Downtown Peoria into a reality that we all take immense pride in.

Finally, as we move into the holiday season, I want to take a moment to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. May this season be filled with peace, joy, and continued progress for our city!


Department and Administration Receptionist Departments. She is responsible to review resale documentation for approval.



# WV Hiking Club DECEMBER 2024 HIKE SCHEDULE

#### In general, hikes are classified as follows:

Easy – 2 to 4 miles with elevation gains up to 400 feet. Moderate – 4 to 7 miles with elevation gains up to 750 feet. Difficult – 7 or more miles with no limit on elevation gain. Total Ascent – adds all the up elevation changes together.

- Dec 6 Ocotillo/Skip Rimsza/Sidewinder Loop Phoenix Sonoran Preserve – approximately a 6.1 mile loop. Moderate. Well-groomed trail that passes through typical Sonoran Desert terrain. First half mile follows Carefree Highway, then heads south. In and out of several washes and parts of the trail are fairly rocky. Good views of mountains and hills of the west valley such as Daisy Mountain, White Tank Mountains, Deems Hills, etc. Last couple of miles will climb near a tower and back to the trailhead. If we are lucky we may see some hot air balloons. Restroom at TH. Driving distance approx. 40 miles RT.
- Dec 13 Chuckwalla Loop Buckeye Skyline Regional Park – approximately a 5.5 mile loop. Moderate. Vegetation on this hike is typical Sonoran desert. Series of three trails to make a loop, in and out of several washes. Restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 70 miles RT.
- Dec 20 Bursera/Gila Loop South Mountain Park approximately 6.0 mile loop. Moderate to difficult. South side of South Mountain Park. Many roller-coaster dips and climbs among the craggy foothills. After about 0.5 miles climb about 600' in about 1.1 miles and there will be good views of the Gila River Reservation. Descend about 560' over the next 1.1 miles into wash and a valley in between two mountains. Very rocky with sections on loose rock. No Restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 80 miles RT.
- Dec 27 Sunrise/Saguaro/Ridgeline Loop (New) Peoria

   Sunrise Mountain Preserve 5.1 mile loop. Moderate.
   Hike uses all of the Sunrise Loop and Saguaro Loop trails plus part of the Sunrise Ridgeline trail. Several ups and downs with some being rocky. Terrain is typical Sonoran Desert. Restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 10 miles RT.
