




Inspirational Reading Recommendations with Roz Farnsworth







WY VETERAN TREASURE



Ric Dickison loves life at WV

RICHARD M. DICKISON CAPT ARTILLERY US ARMY

I initially enlisted in the Army in January 1962, and later obtained the rank as Sargent E-5. I became an officer upon completing Artillery Officer Candidate School. I served in Europe, Korea and Vietnam, along with USA assignments at Fort Hood, Texas, Fort Sill, Oklahoma, Fort Wolters, Texas and Fort Rucker, Alabama. One of my fondest assignments was as a Battery Commander of a 105mm Howitzer Battery in Korea up on the DMZ. I was the youngest First Lieutenant to be given command in a combat zone.

As a senior Captain, I attended Helicopter Flight School, graduating 2nd in my flight school class; which allowed me to pick CH-47 Chinook transition right out of flight school. I knew my next assignment was going to Vietnam, and I wanted to fly the biggest helicopter the Army had...maybe a little safer in combat! This was actually the case; as I didn't see even "one" US troop killed in combat... I was truly blessed!

However, during my last week in country; a new Battalion Commander asked me to show him his AO (Area of Operation). Flying at nose-bleed altitude, one of our OH-6's was shot down, but both crew members survived, but were in the middle of the U-minh Forest. Trees there were 65' tall and very dense (no place to land). Being the only Huey UH-1 in the area, we knew that if the crew was to make it out alive; we had to pick them up. Hovering above the trees; with the entire enemy force shooting at my aircraft with tracers, the Lord was with us. No one nor anything vital to flight was hit. After lifting the downed crew that dangled beneath the aircraft to safety, I was concerned about having to auto-rotate should we have an engine failure, which indeed happened on our way back to the rearm/refuel strip. We hit hard (rotor blades & engine sustained damage), but we all walked away!

Years later, and 4 back surgeries & right wrist frozen, life is good. For the rescue, I received the DFC (Distinguished Flying Cross Medal) which initially caused me embarrassment, as I had seen so little combat. Now at 80+, I embellish the encounter whenever I can.

At the conclusion of the Viet Nam conflict; the military was forced to down-size and I was released from the Army in November of 1972. I had planned on making it my career, as I had grown up as an "Army Brat." Initially, I was devastated, but life had different plans which proved to be better yet.

Following the military, I worked for Boise Cascade Lumber and tried ranching. I then got involved with an Industrial Water Treatment Company, where I learned how to design, manufacture and operate high purity water equipment. After starting my own company; my first contract awarded was for the design and installation of equipment used to treat the lens for the Hubble Telescope.


Following the death of two previous spouses--my first for 43 years and my second for 16 years--I was blessed to meet the most fantastic lady, Marcia Wallber. The short story is that she is the reason why I/we have chosen to settle here in Westbrook Village; and so we can be near her three daughters and seven grandchildren! We are looking forward to meeting and making many new friends.

We honor you, Ric Dickison, and are grateful for your service to our country!





WVA Treasurer's Report

For the month ending October 31, 2024

"The following figures are subject to audit. However, they fairly represent the approximate financial condition of the Association at month end."

GENERAL OPERATING FUND

(Funds designated for day-to-day operations.)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of October was \$1.75 million. For the full year 2024 we are forecasting total revenue of \$3.3 million, of which \$3.0 million will come from homeowner annual assessments. Budgeted expenses forecast for 2024 is \$3.3 million with \$125,000 expected to transfer to our Reserve Fund. Through October, our revenue and expenses are in line with our forecast. However, we continue to monitor expenditures, and undergo higher pricing in products, labor, and availability. In addition, there remains a large "unknown" as to what may lie ahead with regards to home resales, interest rates and the overall economy in 2024.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE FUND

(Funds for major repairs / replacements / improvements)

Cash and CDs on hand at the end of October was \$4.5 million. In 2024 we are forecasting revenue of \$782,000. Revenue comes primarily from new homeowner preservation fees of \$633,000.

The 2024 reserve budget includes a transferred revenue of \$125,000 from the operating budget and projected interest of approximately \$24,000. Through October, interest revenue earned is approximately \$79,600 which exceeds our projected budgeted amount of \$24,000.

Reserve fund expenditures budgeted for 2024 is \$1,142,250. Ongoing expenditures remain planned for perimeter wall repair and painting, Lakes Complex Asphalt replacement, and the Fitness Center Architect. Other normal infrastructure repairs and replacement and expenditures will be addressed as needed.

These financials will be on file at the WVA Administration Office after noon on Thursday, December 5, 2024. The October Treasurers Report will be approved at the November 6 Board of Directors meeting and available the following day. Should you have any questions, please call 623 561-0099 for an appointment.








In December, the Veterans Club holiday party was a festive occasion to eat together, plan for 2025, and give gifts of support. There were four college scholarship awards announced during the evening, owing to funds raised by the club's various fundraising events held throughout 2024. Club President, Carl Ulbrich, and Randy Weiland were honored to also present checks on behalf of the Veterans Club to the following five charities for their efforts on behalf of veterans.



Imprints of Honor

Imprints of Honor (formerly Veterans Heritage Project) develops character and civic responsibility in students by providing experiential learning programs that honor veterans and preserve their legacy. The program bridges the gap between civilian and military life, building students' understanding of our veterans' legacy of service.

AZ Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy

Too many of our heroes who served and sacrificed in our military are suffering in silence with PTSD. Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy of Arizona, an alternative treatment clinic in North Phoenix, and help is needed to treat more veterans with this specialized therapy—a therapy that's still not covered by insurance or the Veterans Affairs Department.

Southwest Veterans Foundation

There are at least 22 Veteran Suicides Every Day. And that's just the official number. Experts believe the number is more likely 24-25 Veterans a day. That is over 9,000 former service members each year we are losing to Veteran suicides, and









the rate of active-duty suicides has increased over the last five years.

WV Hiking Club DECEMBER 2024 HIKE SCHEDULE

In general, hikes are classified as follows:

Easy – 2 to 4 miles with elevation gains up to 400 feet. Moderate – 4 to 7 miles with elevation gains up to 750 feet. Difficult – 7 or more miles with no limit on elevation gain. Total Ascent – adds all the up elevation changes together.

- Jan 3 Butterfield/Coldwater Loop Estrella Mtn.
 Regional Park approx. 6.7 mile loop. Moderate.
 Loop uses part of the Butterfield and Coldwater trails.
 Overall elevation change minimal, but passes through many steep washes which may contain loose rock.
 Entrance fee per vehicle. Restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 65 miles RT.
- Jan 10 Cone Mountain/Cloudburst Loop (New) Scottsdale McDowell Sonoran Preserve Northern Region about 5.3 mile loop &RT. Goes around Cone Mtn. and between Cone Mtn. and Brown's Mtn. Take Upper Ranch Trail to Cone Mtn. Trail, then take Cone Mtn., Hackamore, and West Express to Cloudburst, through many granite formations and boulders which affords good views on the McDowell Mtns. and many of the South Valley Mtns. Cloudburst to high point and follow ridge with mountain views of North Valley and Cave Creek area. Rolling hills with many ups and downs and vegetation is typical Sonoran desert. Restrooms at Brown's Ranch TH. After the hike lunch at The Thumb. Driving distance approx. 70 miles RT.
- Jan 17 Ford Canyon to Dam White Tank Mountain Regional Park (fee) – 7.1 mile RT. Moderate to difficult. Trail starts from parking area at Ford Canyon Rd. First

1.5 to 2.0 miles is fairly level, then begin climb with next mile scrambling over large rocks to reach large rock area to climb over face of large rocks in order to reach abandoned dam (or you can stop here and return to TH for a 6 mile hike). Great views as we gain elevation. Restrooms at TH. Driving distance approx. 50 miles RT.

- Jan 24 Spur Cross/Fairy Duster/Metate/Dragon Fly Loop

 Spur Cross Ranch Conservation Area approx. 6.1 mile
 loop. Moderate. Loop using combination of trails. Short
 stretches are steep and rocky and cross creek several
 times, in and out of several washes. Last mile follows
 Cave Creek and pass by saguaro forest area. \$3.00 fee per
 person. Driving distance approx. 70 miles RT.
- Jan 31 National/Hidden Valley Loop South Mountain 4.8 mile cherry loop. Moderate. Trail starts at Buena Vista Lookout using the National Trail (part of Maricopa Trail System). Descend about 20 ' and then climb about 70 ' to a saddle and reach high point in about 0.35 miles. Then gradually descend about 300' in about 1.3 miles to Hidden Valley Trail, which goes through Fat Mans Pass and natural tunnel, then back to National Trail. Driving distance approxim. 85 miles RT.






